The Meridian Rowing Centre is an area of land adjacent to Lake Ruataniwha with a specific purpose to provide for the sport of Rowing.

During August 2021, South Island Rowing Inc. (SIR) reached out to the rowing community and beyond with a questionnaire. The **purpose** of this was to gain a better understanding of what our community most values about the Meridian Rowing Centre at Lake Ruataniwha. These responses helped to inform the planning for our current facility and allow SIR to capture ideas and opinions which will direct aspirations for future development.

Please read on for a summary of the survey findings.



METHODOLOGY

The results:

how did we obtain them?

The questionnaire was compiled using Google forms, distributed online in August 2021 via a news post on the SIR website which delivers to our Life and Associate members, member Associations, and representatives for Clubs and Schools which participate in rowing in the South Island. The news post was kindly circulated by RowingNZ and our member Associations to their memberships. An article was also included in the "Twizel Update" publication to provide Twizel locals an opportunity to share their perspectives.

The questionnaire was completed by 228 respondents from across New Zealand. Despite the low number of respondents (relative to the number of people involved regularly at our Regattas), there was a good mix of representation from across the Southern regions.

The quality of responses was high and only one duplicate response was received and therefore excluded. SIR Board members were pleased to have responses which represent all parts of our rowing community.

The following graphs and summaries have been extrapolated from the raw survey data. Open ended questions were categorised by theme and will not be directly quoted.

Comments which did not answer the question or were considered irrelevant to the purpose of the questionnaire have been collated and presented to Board members but will not be included in this summary package.


We asked: In which of the following groups do you belong?

Rowing involves many people, in many different roles. The largest group of questionnaire respondents represent Masters Athletes (20%) (Fig 1). When combined with Club and School athletes, 50% of the responses represent Athletes. Those who selected 'Other' were most commonly spectators or general lake users.









The regatta season has an obvious affect on the frequency of respondents visits to the Meridian Rowing Centre. This means that for short periods of time - particularly through the summer - the facility is very heavily used. For much longer periods of time there are generally fewer users who enjoy the space on a regular basis.

Prioritising:

Survey respondents were provided a list of 'projects' at the Meridian Rowing Centre, and asked to prioritise these.

Using a 5 point scale of very low priority (1 point) to very high priority (5 points), participant responses were multiplied and added up to produce a 'score' for each project.

This score has been used to rank the potential projects in terms of importance to the survey respondents.








MERIDIAN ROWING CENTRE | QUESTIONNAIRE RESPONSES PROJECTS | EXISTING FACILITIES

We asked: Below are a list of services and facilities that are provided at the Meridian Rowing Centre. Please indicate how important you think upgrades or improvements are for each of these:





CURRENT PROJECTS

Other projects which are already in progress/ongoing:

Solar investigations

SIR are working with the team at Meridian Energy to investigate opportunities for utilising solar power across the site.

Clearing of seeding pines and management of cleared land

With the removal of a significant size area of wilding pines, plans are underway to see these large areas properly prepared, sown with grass and appropriately irrigated in the short term. Ongoing maintenance of wildings will also be required.

Livestreaming and tech upgrades

New screens, upgrades to wifi and installation of a new pole to support tech upgrades are among a number of changes. These will allow SIR to provide livestreaming through a more modern tech system.

Rowshoppe

The shop space will be undergoing a bit of a revamp to better utilise the building and create a more enticing cafe area. Some fresh merchandise will reveal a special new design representing SIR and Lake Ruataniwha

Plantings and beautification





Start trolley automation

A long term project, automated start trolleys will allow crews to be aligned from the start tower and remove the need for boat holders.

With the support of Meridian Energy, planning is underway to see the staged planting of a number of areas around the complex. This process includes consideration for irrigation.



Our rowing community is made up of many brilliant, hard working, skilled and thoughtful individuals with years of combined knowledge and experience.

SIR wishes to thank all of those who took time to complete the questionnaire and also offer their skills, expertise, business connections or volunteer hours to help see some of these projects come to fruition in the future.

South Island Rowing are committed to continue building the legacy of this facility, protecting it's history and planning for the future.

A purpose built facility such as this has an imperative to provide for activities involved with rowing. The ability for the site to cater for regatta events first and foremost dictates many outcomes for the physical attributes on site.
